

# Greenfields

## IRRIGATION DISTRICT

On Tuesday, August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at 9 A.M. the Greenfields Irrigation District (GID) held its Monthly Board meeting. The following are the minutes taken from that meeting. Those in attendance were: Board President Tim Brunner, Vice President Chase Brady, Commissioners Chris Ostberg, Dave Gulick, and Pat Brosten. District Manager Erling Juel and Board Secretary Jenny Gulick were also present. Also, in attendance was GID's O&M Foreman, Eric Mayer and Jason Hahn with the Bureau of Reclamation, along with Tracy Wendt with the SRWG.

The meeting was called to order by President Brunner at 9:05 A.M. President Brunner reminded the group that public comment would be accepted but held to a maximum of 5 minutes per individual.

**Board to Approve Meeting Minutes and Monthly Warrants:** The first item of business was to approve the minutes of the July 15<sup>th</sup> Regular Meeting. No discrepancies were found, and Commissioner Ostberg made a motion to approve the minutes, and Commissioner Brosten seconded the motion. All in favor and the Minutes were approved. Next, the Board reviewed the July warrants. Manager Juel explained to the Board that the WWC warrant was for half of the Mary Taylor planning grant and Tunnel #3, so GID will get reimbursed by the State for \$15,000. Commissioner Brosten made a motion to approve the warrants and Commissioner Ostberg seconded. All were in favor and the warrants were approved.

**Parties Presenting Issues:** None.

**Contacts to Execute:** Board President to sign the revised Resolution 2025-01 to contract with the USBR for repayment of extraordinary maintenance costs for the rehabilitation of Tunnel #3 after it has been approved by the Board, along with the Vendor Invoice for the Mary Taylor Reimbursement Draw. VP Brady made a motion to approve resolution and Commissioner Brosten.

### **Manager's Report:**

**Reservoir and River Operations:** See M.R. for full details. Manager Juel gave the Board a brief overview of the short water season. He explained that inflows currently are much lower than the 30-year average. FSID has extended their water season to August 28<sup>th</sup>, using river flows which are returns occurring from Divisions 8 & 9 supplemented by what they consider their share of Willow Creek Reservoir. The river is down to 65-70 CFS. The drain season has officially ended, but water users can still take any remaining water if it is there and we don't have to divert it. The National Climate Prediction is now predicting above normal temps and below normal precipitation for August through October with November to January expected to see normal temps and above-normal precipitation.

**Water Rights:** Nothing new.

**GID Staff Updates:** We have released Richard Hart from his employment with GID. Only Tim Kolste remains employed on the weed spray crew and he will be working on spraying ditches that are being

taken over with weeds. Matt Genger went on leave from his seasonal ditch rider position as of last Thursday and Dave Grossman will be done with his seasonal position at the end of the month.

**Office Improvements & General Administration:** On the week of the 18<sup>th</sup>, we will begin the replacement of Nancy's computer, along with the upgrade to the new GIS software.

**GIS Mapping, Plats, Database & Certification Updates:** Nancy is working on the County assessment reports.

**Farm Unit Operations:** The 3 farm unit splits being requested will be addressed during the Agenda portion of the meeting.

**Monthly Financials & 2025 Budget:** See the M.R. for further details regarding accounts receivable and payable for July. Manager Juel had an updated 2025 Budget for the Board to review. Turnbull Hydro income received so far is \$50,000, with not much more expected. Board will need to review the need to increase the assessment fee by 3% or \$1.50/acre to cover inflation of non-discretionary expenses and make a decision during the Agenda portion of the meeting.

**GID Vehicles & Heavy Equipment:** We still need to replace at least 2 Ditch Rider trucks this Fall with two 4x4 long box trucks that will run around \$40,000 each. We are also hoping to replace our +13-year-old CAT 320 excavator. O&M Foreman, Mayer, will get some prices for comparable replacement machines for the Board to review this Fall. Also, we will need to develop a plan to replace our fleet of dump trucks that are +25-years-old. It was proposed that we trade in one of our Volvo trucks and a side dump trailer, to go towards the purchase of the new dump trucks. Mayer and Office Manager Gulick will work with Tri-State and KS State bank to see what our options are.

**Spencer Pearson Lawsuit:** A scheduling conference was recently held and established a trial date of October 2026. The discovery process has now begun again.

**Willow Creek Feeder Canal Maintenance & Lawsuit:** See the M.R. for further details. A mediation/settlement conference was held on August 14<sup>th</sup> at GID's lawyer's office. No settlement was established. The mediator developed a settlement offer based on his understanding of the facts and the Board will need to review and decide whether to accept it. The trial is still set for October 20<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup>. We received an unfavorable decision from the District Court reaffirming that a separate claim is triggered each time the canal is operated.

**Hydro Updates:** General: See the M.R for details. General: Regarding GID's fight with NWE's intent to update the QF-Tariffs: We submitted a motion for reconsideration and the PSC filed a continuation to give themselves more time to make a decision. Transmission Design & Construction: Transmission crews have resumed work on the north side of the river standing poles. Transmission Easements: A switchyard easement on State land west of Jackson's Corner is still pending PPA and wheeling requirements. PPA: There was a brief discussion of our options in securing a power purchase agreement with either Northwestern Energy, Basin Electric or Southwest Power Pool, all have pros and cons. Funding: The next semi-annual WEEG grant report is due in September and the next INTERCAP payment of \$71,488.05 was made on the 15<sup>th</sup>. Construction: A 76 cubic yard pour was completed on the 5<sup>th</sup>. Pishkun Inlet: Manager Juel signed an extension for the LOPP developmental

agreement and sent it off yesterday. NEPA compliance: We have received BOR's final environmental approval, finding No Significant Impact and are awaiting BLM's approval.

**GID Infrastructure Projects:** For Current and Planned, see the M.R. Mary Taylor Facility: Manager Juel needs to file the FERC 556 form, but nothing else new to report. Willow Creek Spillway Repair: GID will need to repay the Bureau back \$411,236.70 and have until September 30<sup>th</sup> at midnight to do so. The BOR's work on the multimillion-dollar, replacement study effort is on hold due to staffing shortage. Sun River Bridge Replacement: It is anticipated that the new bridge will be open by July of 2026, with the old bridge taken down. Tunnel #3 Rehab: We received the \$1M LOC from the bank and sent it to BOR to confirm that we have a source of reserves. Manager Juel met with the contractor to discuss issues and solutions to the Phase I repairs done this Spring before the water season. Phase II construction will begin next Fall with the design already underway. We will have to put the Phase II repairs up for rebid to secure a new contractor for that portion. J-Wasteway: We were able to switch the order of the 2 RRGL projects so that we can commence on J-Wasteway this Fall. Pishkun Outlet Replacement: We are applying for a RRGL Planning Grant to complete a preliminary engineering report and topo surveying. We are considering a title transfer of ownership of the Pishkun Reservoir and rock house. Manager Juel will put together a list of the pros and cons of obtaining ownership and Jason with BOR gave the Board a heads-up that GID may start to see invoices from BOR for work inspections done that don't fit into the annual inspections category.

**O&M Projects and Update:** O&M Foreman, Eric Mayer, informed the Board that the crew has been busy working on Arnold Coulee since the water was shut off.

**Title Transfer:** Nothing new.

**GID Grazing Lease Program:** Nothing new.

**FCA Efforts to Modernize GID Infrastructure:** The bi-weekly meetings with the FCA have resumed. They are currently focusing on a pressurized system with a re-regulation storage pond on the Ashuelot Bench, which would be a 10–15-year plan. Funding strategy may include a special assessment fee assessed just for the individuals that would benefit from implementing this system.

**Groundwater Study with MBMG:** On-going scoping and data collection discussions with MBMG staff regarding the Greenfields Bench Groundwater Study.

**Short and Long-Term To-Do Lists:** See the M.R. for details.

**Agenda:**

- 4) Board to discuss the assessment rate for the 2026 water season, handout provided. Commissioner Brosten explained he is not in favor of raising the rate. President Brunner expressed his desire to have a figure of exactly what it will cost to finish the Arnold Coulee hydro project. The Board wanted to think about it more. Commissioner Brosten moved to table the item until next week's Special Meeting and VP Brady seconded. All in favor and the item is tabled.

**Public Comment:** Tracy Wendt with SRWG gave the Board an update, handout provided. She informed the Board that Lee Signalness is retiring from the SRWG Board in January and asked that they keep it in mind in an effort to find a replacement. She also let the Board know that there is a survey on the website to try to get thoughts on any water issues being experienced, as well as feedback on how SRWG is doing in the public's eye.

**Miscellaneous:** Nothing more to report.

Commissioner Gulick moved to adjourn the meeting and VP Brady seconded. All in favor and the meeting is adjourned at 11:20 A.M.

**1) RESERVOIR & RIVER OPERATIONS AND PROJECTIONS AS OF 08/18/25**

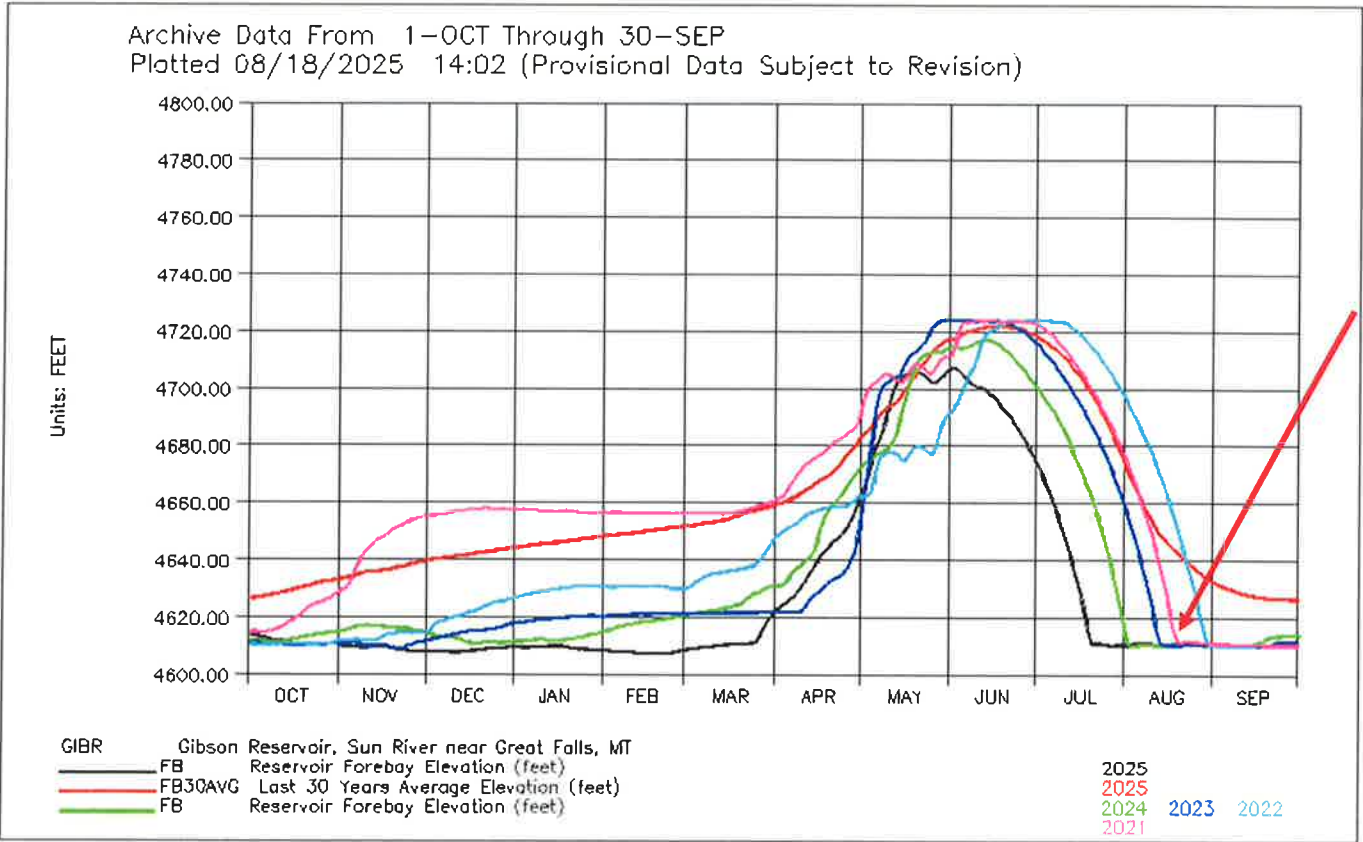
A. Reservoir operations and levels over the last 5 days were:

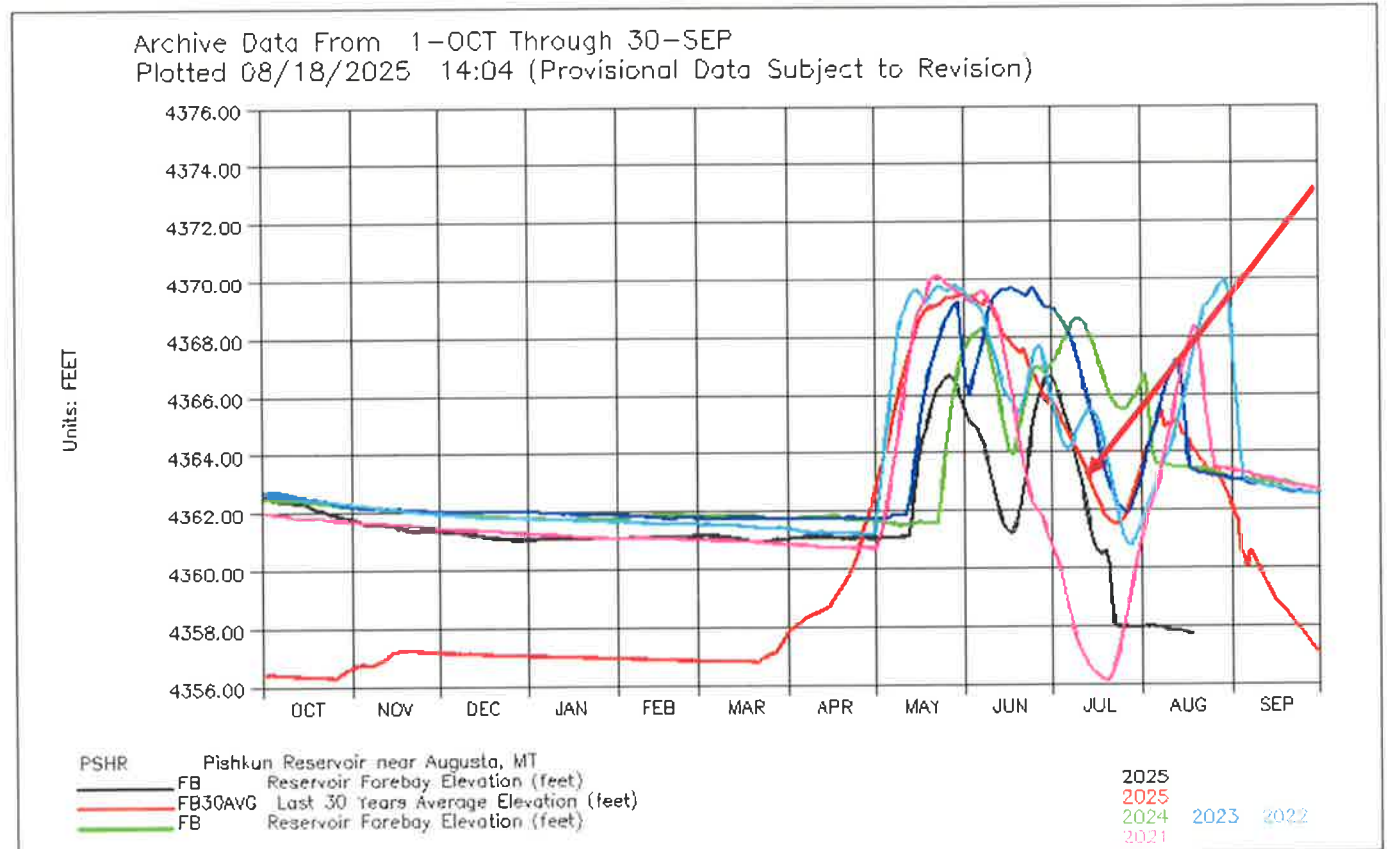
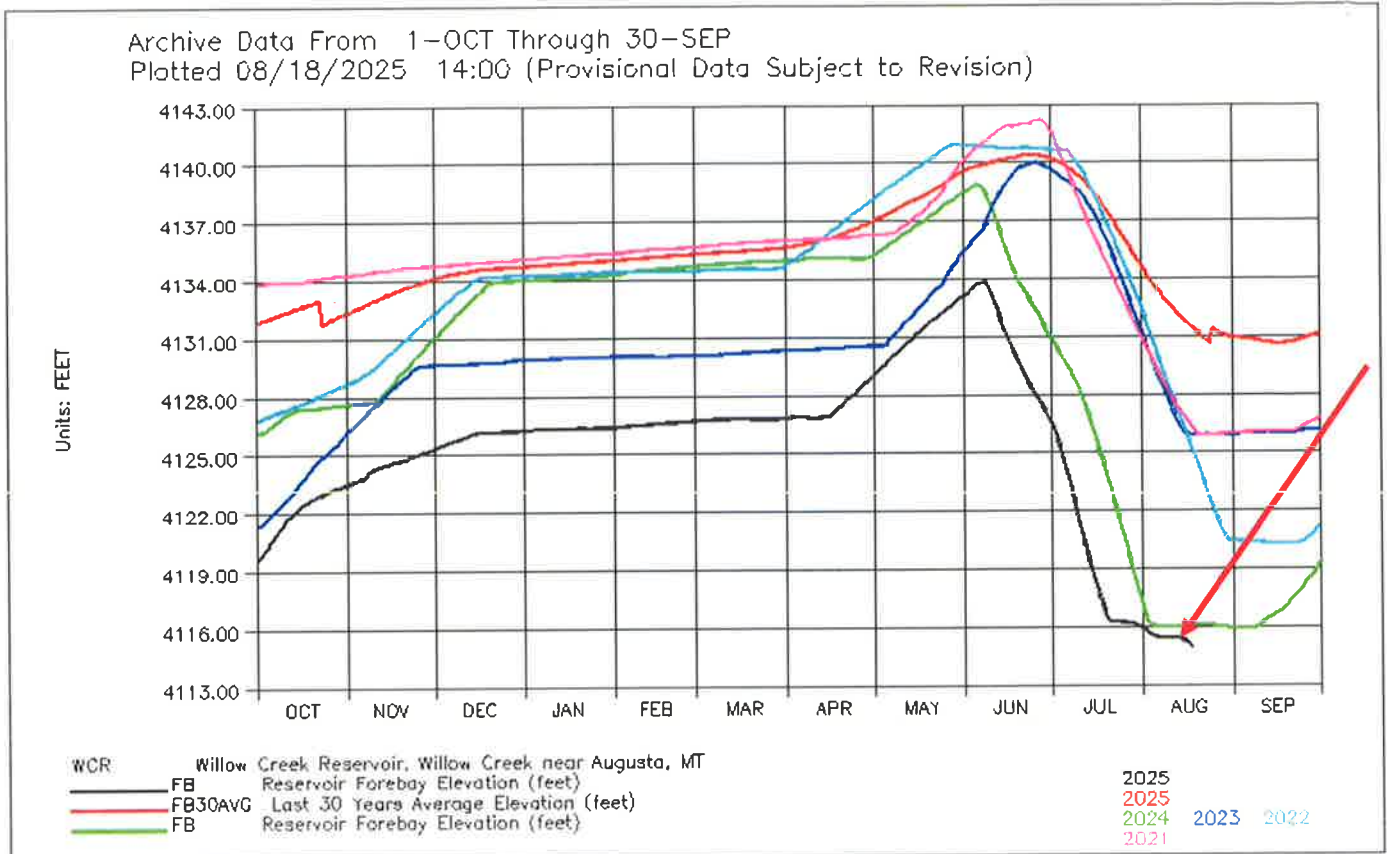
- Gibson Res: 5,560 Ac-ft, 5.6% Full, 25% of Normal,
- Gibson Inflows: varying from 145 to 160 cfs, 45% to 50% of Normal,
- Gibson Outflows: +/-160 cfs,
- Willow Creek Reservoir: 5,100 Ac-ft, 16% Full, 28% of Normal
- Willow Creek Inflows: <5 cfs
- Willow Creek Releases: 15-25 cfs
- Pishkun Reservoir: 14,150 Ac-ft, 65% Full, 76% of Normal,
- Pishkun Releases: 0 cfs,

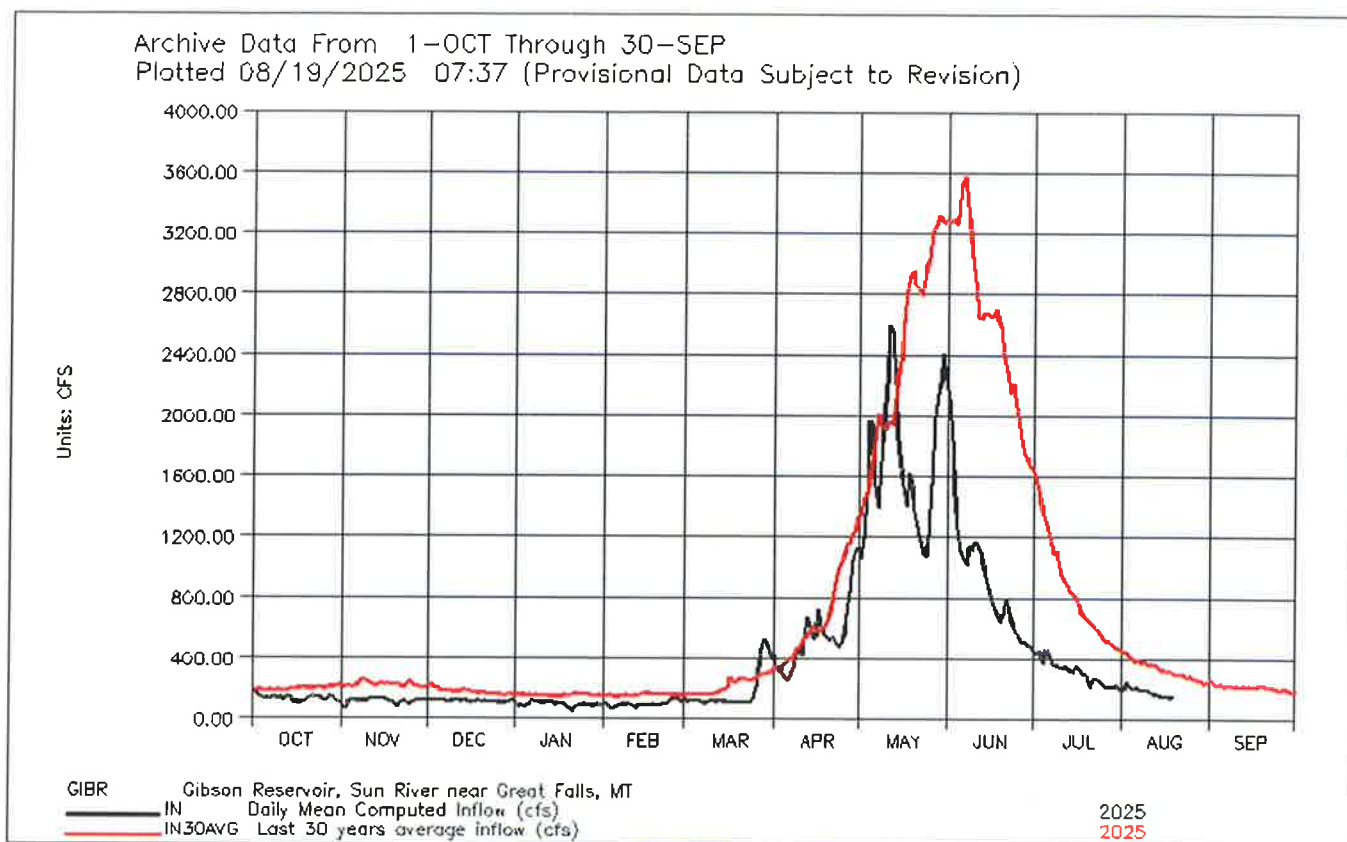
B. Snowpack Levels readings are:

C. The National Climate Prediction Center is now predicting above normal temps and below normal precipitation for August through October. November to January is predicted to be normal temps and above-normal precipitation.







In summary.....

1. Useable storage of Gibson Reservoir was depleted on July 20<sup>th</sup>.
2. Use of Pishkun was terminated on July 24<sup>th</sup>.
3. GID's use of Willow Creek Reservoir stopped on July 20<sup>th</sup>.
4. FSID continued to ask for WCR releases up until August 4<sup>th</sup> and then started again on the 14<sup>th</sup>.
5. FSID said they will end their season on August 18<sup>th</sup>, but then extended it to the 25<sup>th</sup> and as of yesterday, it has been extended to August 28<sup>th</sup>.
6. GID's drain season was limited but will last through August 22<sup>nd</sup>.

The Mediator was asked to develop a settlement offer based on his understanding of the facts as well as his history of such disputes. All parties must agree, each party's decision is secret, and there are no opportunities for follow-up negotiations. Board will review the settlement offer and decide.
- B. Trial date – October 20<sup>th</sup> the 31<sup>st</sup>.
- C. Received an unfavorable decision from District Court basically reaffirming the Federal Court's assertion that a new and separate claim is triggered every time the canal is operated.

## 11)HYDRO UPDATES

- A. General – Regarding GID’s fight with NWE’s intent to update the QF-1 Tariffs.
1. We submitted a Motion for Reconsideration, and the PSC filed a continuation to give themselves more time to make a decision.
- B. Arnold Coulee LOPP – Still hoping to be on-line Spring of 2026.
1. **Transmission Design & Construction** –
    - Transmission crews have resumed work on the north side of the river standing poles. Encountering more areas of hard rock. We have rented the hydraulic rock pick for our excavator to assist with the pole excavations.
  2. **Transmission Easements** –
    - A switchyard easement on State land west of Jackson’s Corner is still pending PPA and wheeling requirements.
  3. **SREC Interconnection & Transmission Agreements** – Nothing new regarding this work. Awaiting finalization of the PPA.
  4. **Power Purchase Agreement** – Negotiations with NWE, SPP, & WAPA are still on-going.
  5. **Funding** –
    - Next semi-annual WEEG grant report is due in September.
    - Next DOC-INTERCAP payment was made on 08/15/25, \$71,488.05. The interest rate dropped to 5%. Expecting another interest rate drop mid-February. We still have \$1.1M available to access if and when needed.
    - Still have concerns regarding tariffs on the generators.
  6. **Construction** –
    - GID crews resumed construction in mid-July setting concrete forms for the powerhouse basement foundation walls and footings for the next tier of retaining walls. This work included extending the draft tube gate guides. A 76-CY concrete pour was completed on August 5<sup>th</sup>.



- Access is getting trickier as we are basically building a concrete pit without an easy way in.
  - We started excavating for the Intake Structure. Encountered some hard rock that will also require use of the hydraulic rock pick.
- C. Pishkun Inlet Hydro – **NEPA and NHPA are still the critical paths.**
1. **LOPP** – Signed an extension for the LOPP Development Agreement.
  2. **NEPA Compliance** –
    - We have received BOR's final environmental approval, Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI). We are awaiting BLM's approval which will occur after their 30-day publication requirement which started on July 28 and ends on August 28<sup>th</sup>. This is posted at BLM's NEPA Registry: <https://eplanning.blm.gov/eplanning-ui/project/2039831/510>
  3. **Funding** –
    - Next semi-annual WEEG grant report is due in September.
    - Once we have BLM's final NEPA compliance we can finalize the DNRC loan which will fund the transmission line construction and the Pishkun Supply Canal Road relocation.
  4. **Transmission Design & Construction** – Design mostly done, construction has yet to start. Expecting to make progress this Fall and Winter, pending final NEPA compliance.
  5. **Power Purchase Agreement** – **Have not started this task.**
  6. **Design Drawings** – Received updated preliminary drawings. Need to turn Sorenson Engineering loose to produce 65% drawings.
  7. **Turbine-Generator Fabrication** – Turbines all paid for. Draft tubes on site.
  8. **Site Construction** – Once NEPA is finalized we can begin with the road relocation phase. By-pass weir is scheduled for next Fall.
- D. Johnson Drop – **Nothing new.**
1. Seeking to update the previously completed NHPA document process.
- E. A-Drop – **Nothing new.** Need to file the FERC 556 Form.
- F. Gibson Hydro – Had preliminary discussions about extending the transmission line up to Gibson Dam.

## **12) GID INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS- Current or Planned**

- A. Mary Taylor Facility –
1. I am reviewing the draft PER. This document will be used to support numerous funding opportunities, both from the State and Federal.
  2. I need to update the hydropower feasibility analysis. Getting a quote and a proposed layout from CHC for the turbine-generator.
  3. No word on the \$4.4 million CDS request (Congressional Directed Spending) submitted through Rep. Downing's office.
  4. No word on the BIL Loan application requesting funding through the Aging Infrastructure Account FY26 just in case Rep. Downing's effort falls short.
  5. Need to file the FERC 556 Form.
- B. Hwy 89 Ditch Crossings – Nothing new.
- C. Willow Creek Spillway Repair –
1. The project costs and finances have been finalized with BOR. **GID will need to return \$411,236.70 by September 30<sup>th</sup>.**
  2. BOR's work on the multimillion-dollar, replacement spillway study effort is sidelined due to staff reduction at BOR's TSC in Denver.

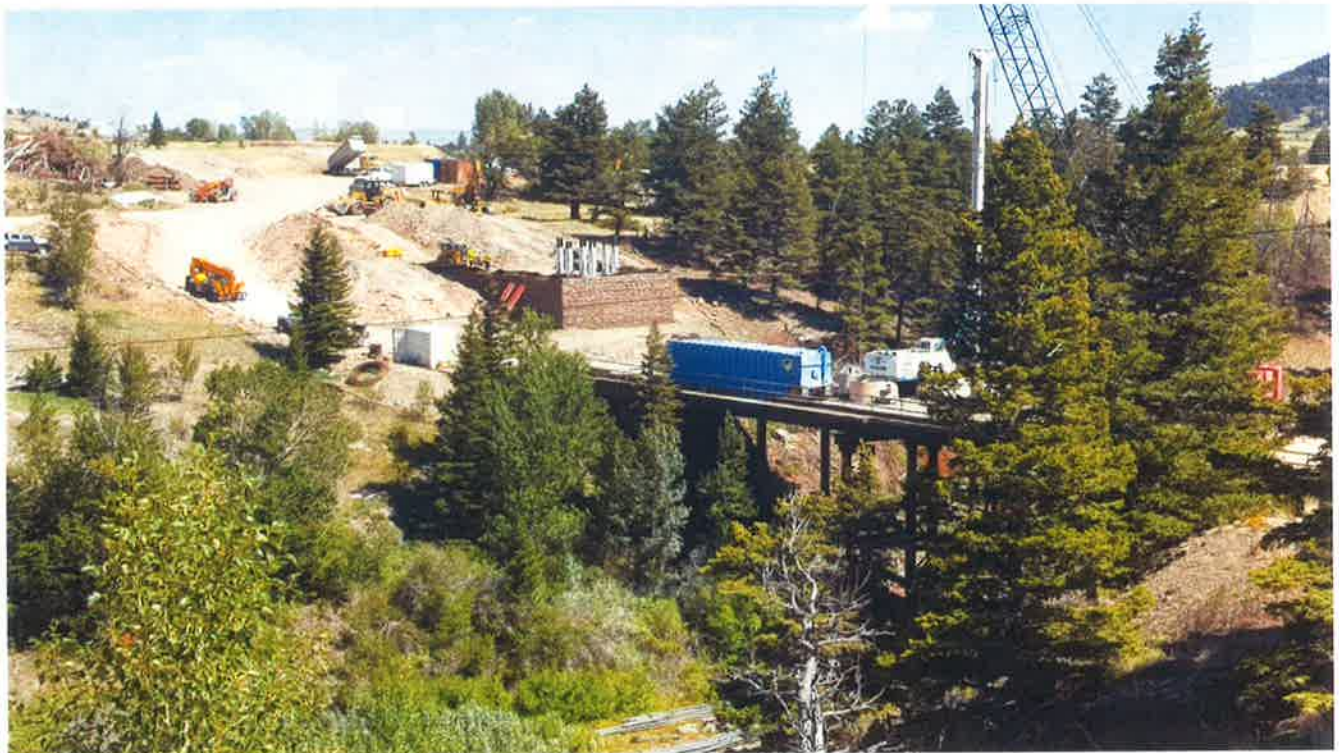
D. Sun River Bridge Replacement

1. Projected Schedule – Still on schedule

- Construction continues. Drilling the main shafts continues. MSE walls are being built around the intermediate pier foundations. Bridge girder fabrication will start in a couple of weeks. They will be delivered and set by the end of September. Winter shutdown is expected in November. Bridge opening and dedication set for July 2026.

2. Status of Old Bridge – Historical designation obstacles have been cleared so that the old bridge can be demolished. Demolition will start once the new bridge is in service.





E. Tunnel #3 Rehabilitation –

1. Received the \$1M LOC from the bank and sent it to BOR. **Need to review and sign the GID Board Resolution 25-01 regarding the repayment contract.** BOR is finalizing the repayment contract.
2. Met with the Engineer and the Contractor to discuss the 5 deficiencies with which GID has concerns.
  - i. Occasional hollow areas.

- ii. Upward displaced sections of the floor at the downstream end.
  - iii. Pitting of the coating along the floor pan.
  - iv. Areas of the field-applied coating which did not stick over the field welds.
  - v. Plastic shrinkage cracking of the concrete transition sections along the base.
3. We also discussed items and areas which could be done differently which would facilitate construction, lower the price, but not compromise the final product,
  4. Contractor is on-site this week doing repairs and developing a strategy.
  5. Phase 2 design is underway and construction will begin next Fall.
- F. J-Waste Way Facility, Spring Coulee Headworks –
1. We were able to successfully switch the order of the two RRGL Projects so that the J-Wasteway project could commence this Fall.
  2. Need to submit the start-up paperwork for the \$125K DNRC-RRG grant that was approved by the State Legislature.
  3. Design and construction to start as soon as a Grant Agreement is in place.
- G. SRS 71 Check Replacement and Reregulation, Phase 2– SRS Main Check
1. Due to the switch with J-Wasteway, this project will not start till July 2026.
- H. Pishkun Outlet Replacement –
1. Nothing new.
  2. Will be applying for a RRGL Planning Grant to complete a preliminary engineering report (PER) and topo surveying.
  3. Our funding application for \$19,054,209 was awarded was BOR. This represents financial assistance regarding extraordinary maintenance work through the Aging Infrastructure Account via the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
  4. Did receive a final version of the Valve Planning Study Report prepared by BOR.

### **13) TITLE TRANSFER**

- A. Nothing new.
- B. BOR is encouraging GID to pursue Title Transfer of Pishkun Reservoir and the surrounding Federal land. Discuss the benefits with Board.

### **14) MISC GID O&M PROJECTS**

- Order at least 2 replacement Ditch Rider vehicles for next season.
- Tabletop Exercise for Sun River EAP September 17<sup>th</sup>.

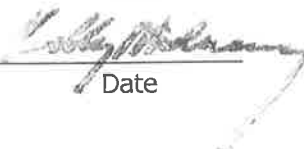
